# HOW TO...

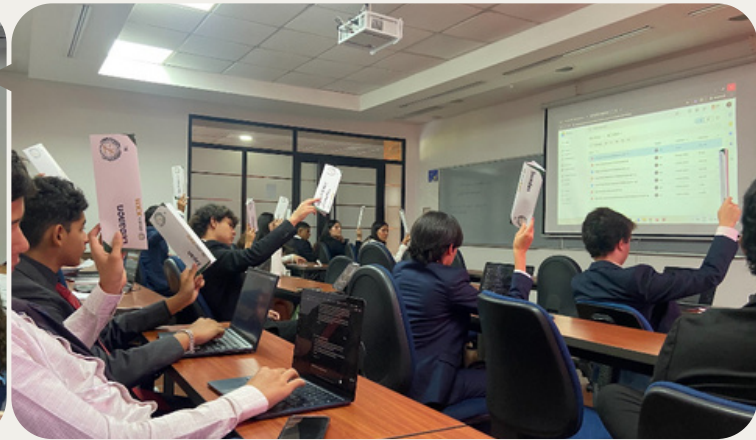
## How to... Write a portfolio:

- Read the guide
- Start with the nation guide to get familiar with the basic information of your country
- Proceed with the research document to investigate your country's position regarding the specific issue
- Try to include statistics, images, graphs or any other specific information
- When you have your position clear for both topics, write two opening speeches briefly describing your country's stance on the issue to let other delegations know
- Remember to send it to the chair through the committee's email.
- Remember the APA bibliography
- Don't surpass the word limit
- Guide yourself from the format as much as possible
- Send it in on time.



## How to... Make a good intervention:

- **Be Concise:** Stick to key points and respect time limits.
- **Start Strong:** Use an engaging opening line or a rhetorical question to grab attention.
- **Support Your Claims:** Use specific examples, statistics, or quotes that align with your country's stance.
- **Be Diplomatic:** Address opposing views respectfully while strengthening your argument.
- **End with Impact:** Conclude with a call to action or a clear solution.
- Try not to read as much as possible



## How to... Write and propose a resolution:

- **Collaborate Strategically:** Form alliances with like-minded delegations early.
- **Follow the Format:** Include preambulatory and operative clauses, ensuring clarity and consistency.
- **Balance Vision and Feasibility:** Propose innovative yet realistic solutions.
- **Promote It:** Actively engage others to co-sponsor and defend the resolution during the debate.
- Do not forget the annex

## How to... Handle points of information:

- **Listen Closely:** Pay attention to the question or comment before responding.
- **Stay Calm:** Maintain a composed demeanor even under challenging questions.
- **Be Direct:** Answer clearly and return to your main argument.
- **Use It Strategically:** Leverage POIs to highlight your delegation's strengths or expose weaknesses in others' positions.
- Remember to ask for a point of personal privilege if you will do an open-ended question.

### What is your main drive to spend so much time and effort in the model?

**What is the most important characteristic a delegate should have?**
